The Purpose of the Pastoral Care Team

In keeping with our First Principle, the Pastoral Care Team models and nurtures a congregational culture where no one needs to journey alone. The Lay Pastoral Associates covenant with the Minister, the congregation, and one another to:

- Provide confidential support through active listening and empathic care to members of the congregation facing a personal or family crisis
- Provide connection to those who are lonely or isolated
- Maintain sustained relationships with members who have long-term needs and provide help as appropriate
- Maintain a full roster of volunteers to assist in UUSD's Helping Hands program.

Caring and Services

The Pastoral Care Team provides a caring presence for UUSD members facing challenges and stresses. Our Minister and volunteers work to offer a loving community and an atmosphere of hope and acceptance. Types of care offered include:

- Support for all ages in times of crisis and joy
- Care and support for significant (physical, mental, emotional, and spiritual) health issues
- Visits in a home, facility, or hospital if the member desires
- Assistance with referrals for mental health, substance use, or other specialized care
- Grief support and referrals
- Rides to local appointments, occasional meals, or trips to the store with the aid of Helping Hands volunteers.

Community is there for us most meaningfully when we let people know what is going on in our lives. Please reach out to let others here know when you're going through a challenging or a joyful time. We are here for one another, and all of us have times of both celebration and struggle.
